| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Characteristics</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Wooden ● High Pitched Sound ● Six Holes ● Relatively Small (approx. 12” - 15”) ● Loud Sound (can be heard on the march and in battle) | <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Characteristics</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cylindrical in shape ● Made of Wood ● Ropes used to tune drum ● Worn over the shoulder / along the side of the musician ● Played with wooden sticks |
| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Uses</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Music on the march ● Play Commands on the Battlefield ● Camp Tunes ● Used for signaling orders within camp | <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Uses</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Marching Speed ● Assembly of Troops ● Set the speed for loading and firing weapons ● Used for signaling orders within camp |
