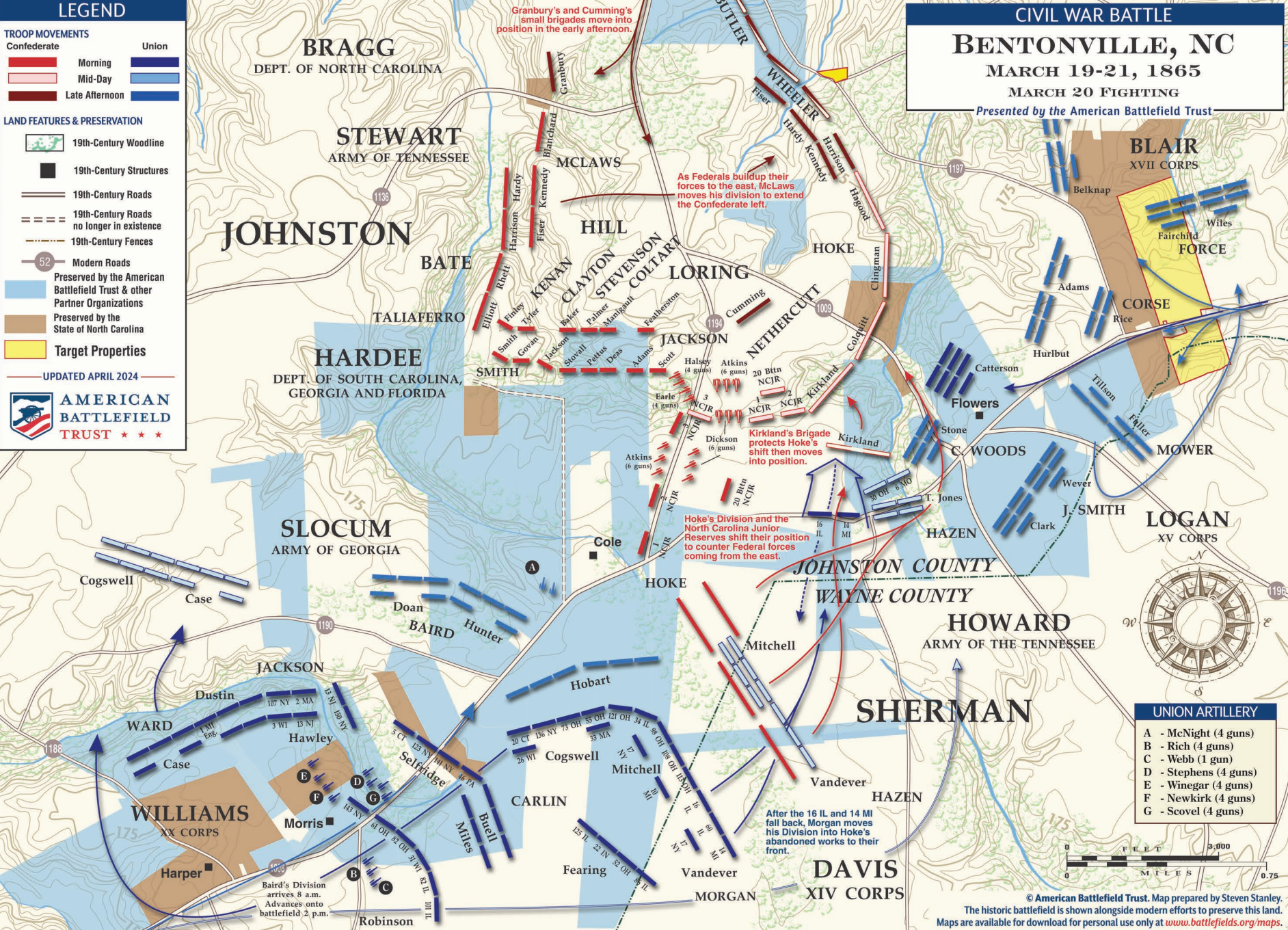

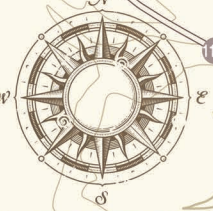
Granbury's and Cumming's (small brigades move into position in the early afternoon.

As Federals buildup their forces to the east, McLaws moves his division to extend the Confederate left.

Kirkland's Brigade protects Hoke's shift then moves into position.

Hoke's Division and the North Carolina Junior Reserves shift their position to counter Federal forces coming from the east.

After the 16 IL and 14 MI fall back, Morgan moves his Division into Hoke's abandoned works to their front.
